Charles William Smith was born May 28, 1931, in Parthenon, Arkansas, to Arvil Andrew “Darb” Smith and Maude Alma McArtor. He died Monday, February 24, 2020, in Claremore, Oklahoma, at the age of 88 years. Charles completed his secondary education in Clarkesville, Arkansas, and graduated with the Clarkesville High School Class of 1949. He was a veteran of the armed forces having served his country honorably with the United States Army. Charles was married November 12, 1950, in Arkansas City, Kansas, to Dorothy White. They had made their home in Owasso, Oklahoma, since 1966. He worked as an aircraft A & P mechanic and spent many years on a field service team performing major overhauls and updating avionics equipment on military aircraft. Those years brought many adventures for he and Dorothy as they traveled all around the United States spending time in every state.

In 1966, he and Dorothy settled in the small community of Owasso, Oklahoma, at which time he began his 25-year career with American Airlines in Tulsa before retiring as a crew chief. He was a faithful member of the Free Will Baptist Church, most recently Collinsville Free Will Baptist Church. Over the years he served in various positions including Junior boys Sunday school teacher, bus ministry, church greeter, and several church boards. Charles enjoyed a variety of pastimes including gospel and bluegrass music. He and Dorothy played in a bluegrass band for many years performing at bluegrass shows, nursing homes, or just jamming with anyone who wanted to play. He also enjoyed antique and classic cars, and was a member of the Model A Ford Club. He spent many hours in his shop restoring model A’s and classic Mustangs.
