Gayle Ledbetter Temple was born June 22, 1949, in San Antonio, Texas to Robert William “Will” Ledbetter and Mildred “Mikki” (Kossey) Ledbetter. She died Thursday, May 7, 2020, in Tulsa, Oklahoma, at the age of 70 years. Gayle was raised and educated in the Houston, Texas area and graduated with the Houston Memorial High School Class of 1967 where she formed lifelong friendships on the Markette Drill team. She went on to earn her Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Texas Christian University in Fort Worth, Texas in 1971. She was also a proud member of the Delta Gamma Sorority at TCU. Gayle spent most of her working life as a registered nurse with various practices in the Houston area. She was married in Houston on April 3, 1993 to Joseph M. Temple, Jr. They moved to Owasso, Oklahoma from Galveston, Texas in 2018 and joined Owasso First United Methodist Church. Gayle was passionate about service to other people, volunteering on missions to South America since she was 16, and church youth mission work later in life.
