Charlie Franklin Lyddon was born August 8, 1978, in Houston, Texas, to Charles Franklin Lyddon III and Rose Marie Patterson Lyddon. He passed away Sunday, August 14, 2022, in Tulsa, Oklahoma, at the age of 44 years.
