David C. McIntire was born January 12, 1949, in Tulsa, Oklahoma, to Ernest Murry McIntire, Jr., and Deretha Wheatley McIntire. He died Saturday, July 11, 2020, in Tulsa at the age of 71 years. David was reared and educated in Owasso, Oklahoma, and graduated with the Owasso High School Class of 1967. He was a veteran of the armed forces having served his country honorably with the United States Army during the Vietnam War. His service decorations and commendations included the National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Bronze Star, Air Medal, two Overseas Service Bars, one Service Stripe, Expert Badge (M-16), Sharpshooter Badge (M-14), and Purple Heart. He was married May 6, 1973, in Albany, Missouri, to Cheryl McCoy. He spent much of his working life as a console operator in the concrete industry. David enjoyed a variety of pastimes including his love for motorcycle riding, particularly on his Gold Wing. He especially enjoyed his role as "Papa". “ My introduction to David McIntyre was at Owasso High School. He was a junior, and I was given the position of being the junior class sponsor. The junior class (as a whole) was to raise funds to pay for the jr. / sr. prom, etc. One of our fund-raising projects was cleaning the race track along Hwy. 169.....which is not just a track but an acreage. The jr class was represented for this job, which was after school or on weekends, by about 10 students, and David was always there. If someone was needed to get something done -- he was the dependable, hard-working volunteer that did it. David was the one who daily kept the HS. Coke machine filled, daily emptied the coin bin, daily counted the money, and daily rolled the coins--all this during lunch. By that comment, I am saying that David was a teenager who was dependable and could be trusted. He had the integrity to be honest (without supervision) and to do a job well (without any recognition from anyone but me). He was always smiling and happy to do work!!

Seeing the list of David's medals and awards earned in the Army, just enforced the image I have had of him. The characteristics of integrity, honesty, dependability and willingness to work evidenced themselves in His service to his country. I hope these attributes were instilled in His children--- for today's world needs such individuals.

Learning of David' s death is only my second account of David since he graduated from Owasso, but I shall always remember the character of David as a youth and shall hope that he was able to retain that character through a war and throughout his life.
