She loved cuddling with all her fur babies. She loved to go on long car rides with the top down, no particular destination, just going. Once she was no longer able to get in and out of the car, the rides had to move to a

larger vehicle, but she was still able to enjoy. She also enjoyed her television shows such as Perry Mason, Law and Order, and developed a love for soap operas.

After years of struggle, Dianne's body decided it was enough. The Friday before she passed, she was able to connect with numerous people she had not seen for some time.
