Donald Ray Drury was born September 10, 1944, in Howe, Oklahoma, to Manuel Richard Drury and Georgia Ann Oliver Drury. He passed away on Thursday, May 15, 2025, in Tulsa, Oklahoma, at the age of 80.

Don was married on November 24, 1962, in Wainwright, Oklahoma, to his wife, Sondra Lee Randalls. He worked at Yuba Heat Transfer for 20 years from 1968-1988. From 1986-1988, Don worked hard to obtain his A&P license, (he scored a perfect score on the licensing test.) He then became an airplane mechanic and inspector for American Airlines, retiring in 2008 after 20 years.

After retirement, Don could be found spending time with any of his six grandchildren whom he adored, He was consistently present at dance recitals, school plays, all the sports, and anything else the grands were involved in. Later on, his three great grandchildren also became the absolute joy of his life.

Don had a servant's heart. He loved helping people. You would often find him at the home of a neighbor- or anyone who needed help- mowing a lawn, fixing an appliance, cutting down tree limbs, shoveling snow, or fixing a car. He could fix anything and never did a job half way, he was a perfectionist at everything he set his hands to.

Don was diagnosed with cancer in August of 2012. His prognosis at the time was maybe 5 years. Don beat those odds and kicked cancer's butt for almost 13 years. We are thankful for the many physicians and the Hand of God that gave us all those extra years with him.
