



Dorothy Mae Griffin

January 27, 1943 - January 8, 2025

Born Dorothy Mae Spiers, those who were fortunate enough to love and be loved by her knew her simply as Dottie. A kind and gentle woman with unwavering faith, she passed away in Tulsa, Oklahoma surrounded by her family on Wednesday, January 8 2025, at the age of 81. She will be laid to rest at Fairview Cemetery beside her beloved husband, Gerald “Butch” Thomas Griffin.

Dottie was one of seven children. She was born on January 27, 1943, to David John Spiers and Edith Mae (Spears) Spiers in Boston, Massachusetts. She graduated with the Randolph High School Class of 1961, alongside her high school sweetheart, Butch. Dottie also attended Randolph Vocational Tech School, where she studied business. At just 15 years old, Butch was captivated by the sweet girl with auburn hair and beautiful green eyes that sparkled when she laughed. After finishing school, Dottie and Butch knew they were destined to be together forever. These high school sweethearts made their commitment official with a wedding in Randolph on May 19, 1962. The couple began their life together in Randolph, but in 1975, they moved with their four children to Talala, Oklahoma, seeking new career opportunities. Dottie brought a strong work ethic and an unwavering dedication to every role she took on. She spent most of her career in manufacturing, eventually working her way up to shipping and receiving manager at Lockheed Martin in Tulsa, where she retired in 2002.

One of Dottie’s greatest joys was the annual trip she took with her sisters,

often to a beach in Florida or the Northeastern coast. Together, they would explore new towns, enjoy fancy tea parties, soak up the sun on the beach, and reminisce over a good glass of wine. Dottie cherished these moments with her sisters, who shared her love of life and laughter.

Dottie was a woman of infinite patience, and her love of children was evident throughout her life. After retirement, she found her dream job caring for children at the Zion Hill Church daycare in Oologah, Oklahoma. She spent many years as a Sunday school teacher for the preschool class at church. She also had a creative side, enjoying sewing, cake decorating, and designing bulletin boards for her daughter Tina's classroom. Another of her favorite pastimes was making QVC purchases while watching the channel on television.

A devoted wife to Butch for 53 years until his passing in 2015, Dottie was also a loving mother, doting nana, and caring friend. She embodied the spirit of kindness, always sharing her love of Jesus with those around her. Dottie's heart was big and her love for her family and friends knew no bounds.

Her legacy lives on in the hearts of her beloved family members who include her children, Gerald Griffin Jr. and wife Kayla, Kirk Griffin and wife Lalita, Tina Jervis and husband Derrick, Aaron Griffin; her grandchildren, Adrian, Gerald III, Keagan, Kyle, Julie, Maegan, Shane, Marisa, and Clayton; her great grandchildren, Gavin, Lilly, Emmy, Zoey, and Gemma; her sister, Betty Emerson; and numerous nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her husband, Butch; her parents, David and Edith Spiers; her siblings, Joan, Shirley, Martha, Alice, and David.
