' Harold Dean Large, longtime Owasso and Talala resident, passed from this life on Thursday, January 21, 2016 at the Claremore Nursing Center. He was 83 years of age. Dean was born September 1, 1932 at Red Fork, Kansas to Clyde and Bernice (Ricketts) Large. He was raised and received his education in Kansas. Dean also enjoyed restoring antique furniture. He worked as a fabricator in the manufacturing of windows for Horner Glass.
