Jack Marvin Hough, Sr., was born October 10, 1937, in Talpa, Texas, to Jesse Travis Hough and Clara Etta Swindell Hough, the last of 11 children. He died Saturday, April 18, 2026, in Copan, Oklahoma, at the age of 88 years. Jack was reared in Wynona, Oklahoma and educated in Mound Valley, Oklahoma, and was a graduate of Mound Valley High School. He was an exceptionally talented athlete, especially in basketball, even receiving a letter from the University of Oklahoma. He continued his education and basketball career at Northeastern Oklahoma A & M, in Miami, Oklahoma. He was married November 27, 1958, in Wynona, Oklahoma, to Ruthie Dee Hurd.

Jack began his working career with Phillips Petroleum Company in 1960. In 1972, he began a career in mainframe computer security with American Airlines that lasted until 1997. He retired for a short time before going back to work with SPR Aerosystems, then later with Stonehinge, working in disaster recovery.
