'OBITUARY FOR JOHN WARD John G. Ward was born August 9, 1932, in Fork Mountain, Tennessee, to Herbert Estes and Margie Mae McCartt Ward. He died Wednesday, January 11, 2017, in Owasso, Oklahoma, at the age of 84 years. John was a veteran of the armed forces having served his country honorably with the United States Army during the Korean War. He was an expert marksman and was also a prisoner of war for nearly three years. He was married October 14, 1953, in Angola, Indiana, to Dorothy Bernice West. John spent most of his working life as a data processing manager. He was faithful to his church and had served as a deacon and Sunday school teacher. He enjoyed a variety of pastimes including hunting, fishing, working in his garden, and horseback riding. He also enjoyed sports and had even coached Pop Warner football. He and Dorothy had made their home in Owasso since 2003. He will be remembered as a man who did so much against all odds.
