Judy Oriel Lingenfelter was born July 14, 1944, in Tulsa, Oklahoma, to Oriel Robert Kirk and Hazel Gladys Kirk. She went to her heavenly home on Monday, December 15, 2025, in Tulsa, Oklahoma, at the age of 81 years. Judy was reared and educated in Tulsa and graduated with the Will Rogers High School Class of 1962. She continued her education attending Oklahoma State University in Stillwater, Oklahoma, where she earned her bachelor's degree in business education. Judy was married on March 25, 1967, in Tulsa, to Tom Lingenfelter. She returned to school earning her master's degree in school counseling at Northeastern State University in Tahlequah, Oklahoma. Judy spent most of her professional career as an educator and school counselor in the Tulsa area with Tulsa Public Schools, Eastwood school, and Union Public Schools. 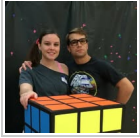
