



Mable Jayne Mitchell

June 6, 1941 - February 5, 2024

Mable “Jayne” Mitchell was born June 6, 1941, in Mountain Grove, Missouri, to Ottis Clinton Flippin and Mable Hefley Flippin. She died Monday, February 5, 2024, in Broken Arrow, Oklahoma, at the age of 82 years following a brief period of illness.

Jayne completed her secondary education in Wagoner, Oklahoma, graduating with the Wagoner High School Class of 1959. She continued her studies at the Oklahoma School of Accounting and spent most of her professional career as a Finance manager with Tulsa Cable. After retiring from full-time work, Jayne worked part-time with various local businesses, providing bookkeeping and accounting services.

On December 27, 1960, Jayne married her high school sweetheart, Donnie J. “Buddy” Mitchell. They remained devoted to each other for over 63 years and provided a beautiful example of commitment and love to everyone who knew them.

Jayne enjoyed a variety of interests. She began genealogy research many years ago as a hobby she shared with her mother. Over the years, she met many fellow genealogy enthusiasts and helped educate family members about their history. Jayne had a great sense of humor and loved gathering with friends or family for a social event or an occasional night out at the casino. As her parents and her mother-in-law entered the last stages of their lives, Jayne and Donnie were also dedicated caregivers for them.
