Marie E. (Rogers) Davison was born January 29, 1929 in Crescent, Oklahoma to James C. and Lola M. (Chambers) Rogers. She passed away October 2, 2023 in Owasso, Oklahoma at the age of 94 years, 8 months, and 3 days.

Marie graduated from Crescent High School in 1947 as class Valedictorian. After graduation Marie continued her education at Oklahoma State University and finished her education at the Stillwater School of Business. Marie married Bobby Lee Davison on July 30, 1948. Bobby and Marie made their home in the Crescent area, where he was a longtime farmer and she pursued a career in the banking business. Until her death, Marie was an active member at Central Baptist Church and her Sunday School class in Owasso, OK.
