Phillip Lowell Perritt was born on November 24, 1959, in Tulsa, Oklahoma to Allen Hines Perritt and Martha D. (Crocker) Perritt. He passed from this life at the age of 65, in his home in Owasso, Oklahoma on Tuesday, November 26, 2024.

Phillip was raised and educated in Tulsa and graduated with the East Central High School Class of 1978. He went on to study at Oklahoma State University and earned a bachelor's degree in aviation management from Metropolitan College of Denver Colorado. Phillip enlisted and served honorably in the United States Army for 20 years in various roles including, Special Forces Battalion and Military Police. He worked as a Tulsa County Sheriff officer at the Adult Detention center for several years before returning to the Army as a Special Agent. He ended his professional career as an Intelligence Analyst with the Federal Bureau of Investigation in Washington D.C.

With his free time, he enjoyed riding his Harley, road trips traveling across the country, Tulsa Driller games, and tinkering on his cars and motorcycles. He especially enjoyed spending time with his family. He is survived by his sister, M. Darnell Perritt and her husband Bob Rolene. His nephew, David Rolene and his niece Robyn Hildestad, husband Casey, and his great niece Adelynn Hildestad. His brother Allen H. Perritt Jr. and his wife Denise.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Allen and Martha.

A graveside service will be held 12:30 p.m. on Friday, December 13, 2024, at Fort Gibson National Cemetery in Fort Gibson, Oklahoma.

“ I am a life long friend of Phil and we first met at Oklahoma State University as freshmen in 1978. We became room mates for a year before Phil joined the US Army to secure the Army college fund to help him finish college and to serve our country. After graduating from basic training with the US Army, Phil was assigned to Furth Germany as a Military Police specialist where he patrolled the wall between East and West Germany in the days before the wall fell reuniting the two Germany's. While Phil was in Germany, I used to hear all about his exploits while he was traveling all over Europe and Germany. He always said he had a great time while he was there and I believe him!

We always kept in contact over these many years and got together quite often to have lunch, dinner, see a movie or go shooting. We used to go shooting on a regular basis and prior to him passing, we were planning on going shooting that week as well. Shooting was a huge interest for Phil and was always going to gun shows and researching pistols. My mother always considered Phil a part of our family as he used to see her as often as he could when she was living in Oklahoma City.

I joined the USAF after graduation from Oklahoma State and we always talked about the differences between the US Army and the Air Force but I could never get him to transfer to the Air Force as he really did love being a part of the US Army despite living in mud most of the time. When Phil was working for the FBI in Washington DC, I was also transferred to DC and we regularly spent time together as he lived a short distance away from my house. While in DC, Phil was over at our house on a regular basis for dinner or to watch the Dallas Cowboys play. We both loved to watch the Cowboys play!

When Phil was serving in Iraq, we spoke on the phone almost every other day as he endured in Iraq and served on the protection detail for Ambassador Paul Bremer as a US Army CID Special Agent. When he left Iraq, he commented that that was an interesting time

but he doesn't want to go back!

I will miss my friend very much and I could go on and on about Phil and what a super person he was and what he meant to me and my family.
