Bob was raised in Lightsville, Illinois and graduated with the Leaf River High School Class of 1976. After high school, he enlisted and served his country honorably in the United States Navy Seabees. Upon returning home, Bob worked at a local factory where he met wonderful new friends who invited him to church. Bob learned how much God loved him and he gave his life to Christ, forever changed. Bob attended Rock Valley Community College in Rockford, Illinois and then the University of Illinois in Chicago and earned his Bachelor's Degree in Mechanical Engineering. He was married on June 15, 1985, in La Crosse, Wisconsin to Bonnie Ann (Larson) Pingel. Bob spent most of his working life as a Mechanical Engineer with what is now Collins Aerospace. He was a faithful member at Freedom Church in Owasso, Oklahoma since moving to Owasso in 2006. Bob enjoyed serving on the Freedom Church Worship Team where he worshipped God while playing his guitars. He also kept a keen eye out for any new visitors to Freedom Church warmly welcoming any new folks that he could. As a side job, Bob gave guitar lessons at Charis Music Studio in Owasso where he taught hundreds of students over 10+ years, loving his students as much as
