I have 1,000 memories from my time at her house on 168th E Ave - we lived across the street and up one. I'll forever hate June bugs because of the blanket she hung in the garage one summer on a clothes line, it was folded so that we could get inside it (which was cool) but then the June bugs came out and started dive-bombing that blanket with us kids inside and you could hear and feel them hitting the blanket. So crazy the things we remember. One time, she let me play with her original Star Wars dolls and Enterprise stage set. It was the coolest thing! I always wanted a game closet like she had- a closet full of nothing but games and toys in the hallway for us kids she babysat. I have had that in 3 or my 4 houses and the 4th, I had 2 wire racks in our game room full of games. To this day, I still eat ketchup and Miracle Whip stirred together to dip fish sticks in, lol. Before Mo starting babysitting me, I went to the daycare run by her mom Dorothy Stockler at our church, First Baptist Owasso, across from the old Barnes Elementary/Ram Academy building. I will always remember one day Payne and a couple other of us kids were playing outside when Payne and another boy thought it would be fun to throw the pea gravel, from the edge of the road, at passing cars. One woman didn't think it was funny and stopped her car, jumped out, put Payne over her knee and started spanking his rear end. Mo came out screaming at her to stop or she would do the same to her. Truly so many memories. The last time I saw Mo was at Becky's funeral. I sure miss her - her smile and laugh will always remain with me.
