



Steven Ray Holleman

June 15, 1954 - December 1, 2023

Steven Ray “Steve” Holleman was born June 15, 1954, in Dallas, Texas, to Marvin Ray and Betty Sue Holleman. He died Friday, December 1, 2023, in Owasso, Oklahoma, at the age of 69 years. Steve was reared and educated in Dallas where he graduated with the Sunset High School Class of 1972. He continued his education at Panola Junior College in Carthage, Texas, then finishing at American Christian College in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Steve was married December 28, 1974, in Carthage to Betty Gray. His professional career began in education at Roxton High School in Roxton, Texas, before coming to Owasso, Oklahoma, with Owasso Public Schools.

Steve had a decorated career as the longtime assistant baseball coach with the Owasso Rams Baseball team with his college roommate and head coach Larry Turner since 1981. He was a major part of 1,145 wins and a dozen State Championships for one of the most successful baseball dynasties ever at the high school level. His honors included VCA District 6 Assistant Coach of the Year in 2001, Bob Taylor Award for Dedication in 2007, Oklahoma Coaches Association All-State Coach in 2008, Oklahoma Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame 2013, Oklahoma Assistant Coach of the year in 2017.

Steve taught Strategies for Academic Success at the Owasso 8th Grade Center and was selected as Owasso Public Schools Teacher of the Year in 2021. He and Betty were honored by the Owasso Chamber of Commerce who selected them as Mr. and Mrs. Trail Days for 2020.

Steve was a strong man of faith and was a longtime member of First Baptist

Church in Owasso. He was known for serving the community of the Owasso Baptist Village, driving the “Beulah Babes” to church every Sunday morning and Wednesday night. He was a true servant always willing to do or help anyone

Steve enjoyed a variety of pastimes, but particularly spending time with family and friends. He liked listening to music and making CD’s for his friends. He enjoyed going to the bowling alley and was a talented bowler. He dearly loved his wife Betty, spending time with her, especially on Saturday’s going to lunch and a movie together. Steve will be cherished in the hearts of the countless friends he has made and influenced over the many years, and who dearly loved him.
