He continued his education at Rogers State University in Claremore, Oklahoma, then at the University of Oklahoma, in Norman, Oklahoma, where he earned his master's degree. He was married May 20, 1976, in Lyons, Kansas, to Cathy Long. Travis spent most of his working life as a drug and alcohol counselor and was committed to helping homeless veteran escape addiction. He worked for 12 & 12 in Tulsa as well as with Bryce House. He enjoyed a variety of pastimes including spending time on his computer and playing games on his iPad.
