Wilda E. "Willie" Yard was born September 16, 1942, in Franklin, Pennsylvania, to James Samuel and Emma Edith Sweetapple, Johnson. She died Wednesday, January 1, 2020, in Claremore, Oklahoma, at the age of 77 years.
